Lyricist Bob Hilliard has several big hits to his name, including 1949's "Dear Hearts and Gentle People," and 1952's "Bouquet of Roses." Composer Mort Garson and he were reluctant to allow the unknown group Ruby and the Romantics to record this song, but their recording was catapulted to the Number 1 spot on the Billboard Hot 100 only six weeks after its 1963 release.
